What is University of Scouting?

University of Scouting is a day-long event combining several training opportunities into one exciting learning opportunity for all adult Scouters and youth leaders!

To recognize your success in attending and completing the various courses offered, University of Scouting offers a degree program in three areas – Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting, and Venturing – with some Elective and District courses to round out the curriculum. Participation on the degree program is **not** mandatory, however, and course may be taken regardless of whether or not Basic Leader Training has been completed.

Degree Requirements

- It is not a requirement that a student pursue a degree to attend the University. You may take courses from any College and from the list of Elective courses. To attain a degree in one of the Colleges, however, the requirements outlined below must be met.

Associate of Scouting

Prerequisites: None

Requirements: The Associate's Degree is awarded to a first-time student upon completion of six hours of courses at the University. You may take any courses from any College.

Bachelor of Scouting

Prerequisites: Hold an Associate of Scouting Degree earned at a prior University of Scouting Session or an Associates of Cub Scouting Degree earned at a prior POW WOW, College of Cub Scouting event.

Requirements: The Bachelor's Degree is awarded to a student upon completion of six hours of courses **after** earning the Associate's Degree. You may take any courses from any College.

Master's of Scouting

Prerequisites: Hold a Bachelor of Scouting Degree earned at a prior University of Scouting Session or a Bachelor of Cub Scouting Degree earned at a prior POW WOW, College of Cub Scouting event.

Requirements: The Master's Degree is awarded to a student upon completion of six hours of courses **after** earning the Bachelor's Degree. You may take any courses from any College.

What's New at 2011 University of Scouting

- **Construction City Training is being offered at U of S this year from 9:00 am until 11:00 am. U of S Participants may attend this training and have it count towards their U of S degree. However, leaders who are completing JUST the 2-hour Construction City Training and not the full 6-hour event will not be charged.**
- **Leaders who have paid to attend the full U of S event will be given wristbands. It will be necessary to wear your wristband in order to attend any session other than Construction City Training and be served lunch.**
- **Preregistration is encouraged this year and only those people who preregister are guaranteed to receive the 2011 U of S event patch.**

Scout Leader Position Specific

Basic 01 – Cub Leader Specific: Modules 1 & 2 – Lee Schultz- The first two modules of the **NEW** Cub Leader Position Specific training! To be followed by Position Specific training later in the day. **2 hour course**

Basic 02 – Tiger Den Leader Specific – Jamie Meyers - Upon completion of modules 1 & 2 of the new Cub Leader Specific Training, new Tiger Den Leaders will attend this course to get information specific to running a Tiger den, including how to set up the meetings, plan a calendar, and coordinate with other parents. **2 hour course**

Basic 03 – Den Leader Specific – Bob Quick - Upon completion of modules 1 & 2 of the new Cub Leader Specific Training, new Wolf/Bear Den Leaders will attend this course to get information specific to running a den, including how to set up the meetings, plan a calendar, and coordinate with other parents. **2 hour course**

Basic 04 – Webelos Leader Specific – Russ Eby - Upon completion of modules 1 & 2 of the new Cub Leader Specific Training, new Webelos Leaders will attend this course to get information specific to running a den, including how to set up the meetings, plan a calendar, and coordinate with other parents. **2 hour course**

Basic 05 – Cubmaster Specific – John Nyers - Upon completion of modules 1 & 2 of the new Cub Leader Specific Training, new Cubmasters will attend this course to get information specific to running a pack, including how to set up the meetings, plan a calendar, and coordinate with other parents. **2 hour course**

Basic 06 – Pack Committee Specific – Lee Shultz- Upon completion of modules 1 & 2 of the new Cub Leader Specific Training, new Pack Committee Members will attend this course to get information specific to the administrative functions of a pack, including the annual planning conference, setting up a calendar, and coordinating with other parents. **2 hour course**

Basic 07 – Pack Trainer Specific - Upon completion of modules 1 & 2 of the new Cub Leader Specific Training, new Pack Trainers will attend this course to get information specific to this new positioning Cub Scouting. **2 hour course.**

Basic 08 – Scoutmaster & Asst. Scoutmaster Leader Specific – Mike Pierson - One of three courses needed by Scoutmasters and Asst. Scoutmasters to be considered basic trained (along with “This is Scouting” and “Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills”). **ALL DAY COURSE!**

Basic 09 - Troop Committee Challenge – Bob Quick - Troop Committee Challenge training is designed to help each troop committee work as a team to improve the Scouting experience for adult and youth members. **3 hour course**

Basic 10 – Youth Protection Training – Ed Taylor - learn about the latest issues and concerns we face as leaders who want to present a safe program for the youth we serve. **2 hour course**

Basic 11 – Chartered Organization Representative Training – Charlie Horne–

This Training is designed to orient the new CORs and serve as a review for those with Scouting experience. *"This is Scouting"* should be completed prior to taking this course. **3 hour course**

Basic 12 Merit Badge Counselor Orientation – National syllabus is presented for this training of the Merit Badge Counselor and Merit Badge Process. Course content includes Coaching and Counseling tips, Youth Protection Training issues and "no more, no less".

Basic 13 – Youth Protection Training for Venturing and Exploring Adult Leaders – Scott Moffett – this course covers those issues concerning leaders of Venture Crews and Explorer posts including information on co-ed protection, fraternization, and age appropriate issues.

College of Cub Scouting

Cub 01- Cub Scout Advancement –Gary Holewinski - Learn the purpose of advancement in the Cub Scout Program and how it differs from one level to the next. Discussion will focus on program goals, parent and leader responsibilities and how they change from Tigers through Webelos. Get all your questions about advancement answered as well as tips on how to make it happen in your den.

Cub 02 - Webelos-to-Scout Transition – Eric Crimmins - If you are a Webelos leader, or are going to be one soon, this is the course for you! Find out what you need to know to help your Webelos Scouts make the transition from the Cub Scout Pack to the Boy Scout Troop. (Scout 08)

Cub 03 - Cub Crafts – Myriah Crimmins- Something old, a few things new, everything borrowed and no one walks away blue. An update of past crafts sessions with many of your old favorites and some brand new crafts. There is also a group of crafts designed to help with the Webelos Craftsman Activity pin. There will be enough crafts to keep your Cubs busy with crafts for every rank.

Cub – 04 - Cub Camping – Bill Moffett & Scott Moffett - Put the OUTING back in SCOUTING!!! Pack and Den Outings! Cub Scout Camping! Understand the importance of family camping for your pack. Find out the how to, why, and where to go. Make family camping an annual event in your pack. (This is not BALOO Training)

Cub 05 –Cub Games – Richard Fiedler – learn about indoor, outdoor, and quiet games for Cub Scouts.

Cub 06 - Pack Paperwork - Jamie Meyers - learn what every leader should know about Pack Paperwork. This class will involve hands-on experience in completing sample paperwork, discussions on paperwork guidelines and procedures for using specific forms.

Cub 07 - InSTEP with Cub Scouts – Jamie Meyers - Designed for multi-grade dens, InSTEP delivers a fun & exciting program focused on the boys! Learn how to use this great program to involve your parents. Program plans are designed for small packs so that all Cub Scouts can earn their advancement. KISMIF!

Cub 08a - Construction City General Training - Janni Juhasz & Christopher Jackson - This course teaches both returning volunteers and new about what is Construction City, how to prepare for it and what happens before, during and after the actual event. The first of two mandatory courses each volunteer needs to take. Will be followed by either Cub 08b or Cub 08c as needed. This course is being offered for the first time at U of Scouting and replaces the training that was originally held at Camp Miakonda on the first Sunday of November. **(NOTE: If you are only taking the two Construction City modules, no registration fee will be charged)**

Cub 08b - Construction City Bridge Builder Training – The second of two mandatory courses that new and returning volunteers need to take specific to working with 5th graders participating in the Bridge Building component of Construction City. This course is being offered for the first time at U of Scouting and replaces the training that was originally held at Camp Miakonda on the first Sunday of November.

Cub 08c - Construction City House Builder Training - The second of two mandatory courses designed to cover issues specific to volunteers working at the house building component of Construction City. Learn about the flow of the actual day, the permit process, strong leaders, and the construction city house builder specific items. This course is being offered for the first time at U of Scouting and replaces the training that was originally held at Camp Miakonda on the first Sunday of November.

Cub 09 - The ABC's of Webelos Activity Pins - Gary Holewinski - The Webelos program is the most fun for boys but can be the most confusing for leaders! We'll show you which activity pins you really need to do, how to do them and where to get help! You'll see some great ideas to add to your program and plus also focus on leadership skills, outdoor skills and fun! For Bear and Webelos leaders

Cub 10 – Den Leader Roundtable – Gary Holewinski- If you're a Cub Scout Leader and would like to talk with other leader and see what's worked and what hasn't and maybe trade stories (worst craft experience) sign up, come on down and pull up a seat next to the campfire with some of your fellow leaders. Former Den Leader and Cubmaster.

Cub 11 - Q & A for Cub Leaders – Eric Crimmins – Here's your chance to get the information on issues not covered in the basic training sessions.

College of Boy Scouting

Scout 01 - Ceremonies and Courts of Honor – John Bailey - Learn about opening, closing, individual and group recognition. Make your Courts of Honor memorable.

Scout 02 - Leave No Trace – Rodger Phillips - This course will be a basic overview of the Leave No Trace principles and their application to camping by Boy Scout Troops and Venture Crews.

Scout 03 - Campfire Cooking - John Bailey – Learn the different methods of cooking on a campout: foil cooking, Dutch oven, how to cook a Turkey!

Scout 04 – First Class in the First Year – Eric Crimmins - Learn how to plan a comprehensive program for your New Scout Patrol using the First Class Emphasis Program, getting results in advancement, achievement, and excitement!

Scout 05 - NYLT Scoutmaster Orientation – Pat Sutherland - Overview of what your Scouts learn when they attend National Youth Leadership training (NYLT). This orientation is required for Scoutmasters to receive the Scoutmaster Key.

Scout 06 - Webelos to Scout Transition – Eric Crimmins - Learn what the troop's role is in helping Webelos join your Boy Scout Troop. (Cub 03)

Scout 07 - Being an Effective Eagle Advisor – Bob Ruff - The process of advancing from Life to Eagle rank is greatly enhanced by the guidance of a well-informed Eagle Advisor. This module defines the role and describes how to employ it most effectively.

Scout 08 - Awards for Boy Scouts – Gary Holewinski - Learn what awards are available to Boy Scouts beyond the basic advancement requirements.

Scout 09 – Outfitting the First Year Scout – Alan Bernard - learn what gear, gadgets and resources your new scout needs as he embarks upon his career as a first year Boy Scout

Scout 10 - Introduction to Orienteering – Gary Paczner – learn how to use a compass and back-up methods to determine North and direction of travel

Scout 11 - Eating on the Trail – Myriah Crimmins - Learn how to pack food for the trail. Keep it light weight, but have the rest of camp wish they had you pack food for them. This session covers everything from day long to overnights and the different types of back packing stoves that are out there. **(2 hrs)**

Scout 12 - Intro to Camping Equipment – Scott Ragan - New to camping and don't know whether to buy down or polyfill? How do you select a pack; shoes, boots,

socks, or raingear? What steps should be taken to properly maintain both personal and group equipment? Here's the help you've been looking for.

Scout 13 - How to Conduct a Board of Review – Kathy Bomer - This workshop will train troop committee members and others in the purposes of the board of review, offering suggestions for the types of questions that can or should be asked.

College of Venturing

Ven 01 - Super Trip Planning – Scott Moffett - For Venture Crews and Boy Scout Troops looking at planning a Super trip. Destination selection, funding, organization, transportation, equipment, tour permits, insurance, etc.

Ven 02 - Passport to High Adventure - James Whitehead - This course will explore the "5 W's and an H" of High Adventure. Many older Scouts and Venturers consider high adventure the highlight of their outdoor Scouting experiences; it's what keeps them high on Scouting. High adventure challenges and inspires them and broadens their appeal for Scouting. Included will be information on our BSA National High Adventure bases as well as planning and safely carrying out other unit high adventure treks.

College of Commissioners

Comm 01 - Unit Lifesaving - Turning Impending Disaster Into A Promising Future - Time can truly be of essence when a unit is in immediate danger of collapse. If prepared, a commissioner can turn a unit facing impending disaster into unit whose future is bright with promise. This session begins by setting the stage for identifying a unit in need of a lifesaving commissioner, followed by a discussion of the basic steps in unit lifesaving. We will then explore real-life examples of units in need of immediate assistance and options available to a commissioner that can lead to success.

Comm 02 - Unit Visitation - Service To Your Units Begins Here
Service to your units begins with the unit visit. This session will provide valuable insights from some of our most effective commissioners on how you can be a true help to your units. We will then explore a variety of easy-to-implement tools and techniques you can use to make your unit visit a success.

Comm 03 - The Commissioner's "Top Ten" Retention List Top Ten lists are everywhere, but few are as meaningful as the top ten list to be covered in this session. This session will explore the top ten findings of a recent formal and extensive research project in Northern Ohio regarding recruitment and retention at all levels of Scouting. Commissioners and non-commissioners alike will leave this session with a new appreciation for the keys to success as we begin the 2010 Scouting year. **(2 hr session)**

Comm 04 - Successful Unit Charter Renewal - Rechartering can be a major challenge to unit leaders at all levels of Scouting. Failure to recharter properly can lead to serious problems for both the youth and the leaders in that unit. As a Unit Commissioner, if you understand the on-line rechartering process you will be prepared to offer real assistance to your unit leaders. Unit charter renewal is just around the corner. Here is your chance to learn exactly how the process works. We will also present some great ideas for helping your units register on time with minimal loss in membership and leaders.

Comm 05 - Cub Scout Roundtable Commissioner, Roundtable Staff Basic Training, and Boy Scout Roundtable Commissioner Training – Mary Lee Foley - Commissioner 05 - Cub Scout Roundtable Commissioner and Staff Basic Training, and Boy Scout Roundtable Commissioner Training - While a Scouter can join us at any time during the day, the complete session is required to earn the Scouter's Key. Cub Scout and Boy Scout information will be presented together, so anyone who attends the full session will be trained for both.

Electives

EI 01 - Leatherworking – Don Maier - Get hands on experience with leatherworking activities to share with your scouts. This is an open workshop.

EI 02 - Scout Unit Parent Coordinator – Have you volunteered (or been voluntold) to serve as your unit's Scout Parent Coordinator, but don't really know what is expected of you? Then this is the class for you!

EI 03 - Flag Etiquette – Ed Taylor - Flag procedures including proper saluting, raising, lowering, and much more in this "Respect for the Flag" oriented session.

EI 04 - Promoting Religious Emblems Duty to God Promotion Patch – Gary Nordhal - You may be an expert at Camping, tying knots, and the outdoors, but how much do you know about the Scouting's Religious Emblems programs? This 50 minute program developed by PRAY, will lead you through the steps for using the Duty to God Promotion Patch Program to encourage your Scouts to make a commitment to Duty to God.

EI 05 – Promoting Your Unit – Frank Merritt - Scouting too often is the best kept secret in the community. Learn the basics - and the do's and don'ts - of publicizing your upcoming events and the activities and achievements of your Troop or Pack.

EI 06 - Light of Christ & Parvuli Dei – Gary Holewinski - learn about the Light of Christ and Parvuli Dei programs. Find out how easy they can be and more importantly how much FUN they can be. Learn how to get the families involved and get the boys enthused. Taught by the Chair of the Toledo Diocesan Catholic Committee on Scouting, the same person who does the Cub Scout Retreats. Make it fun, keep them coming back.

EI 07 - Ad Altare Dei & Pope Pius XII – Have you wanted to help with Catholic religious emblem program but didn't know how to start? You start with AAD & PPXII counselor training. This is one of two components necessary to become an Ad Altare Dei or Pope Pius XII counselor. The other requirement is to read the Scout and counselor booklets. So sign up, talk to folks who've done the program, and find out how to be a top notch counselor.

EI 08 - New Guideline Changes (Matt Shanahan) – National and Council: This course covers important changes our leaders need to know. A good chance to learn important changes you may have missed in *Scouting* magazine.

EI 09 - Understanding Insurance and the New Tour Plan (Matt Shanahan?) – get the low down on when, where and how to use the new Tour Plan and how it relates to liability insurance for scouting units.

EI 10 – Scouting's Journey To Excellence – Joel Moszkowicz - This session will explain the NEW performance recognition program that is replacing the Centennial Quality Award. Discussion about the changes in the basic way we measure and recognize success of Councils, Districts, Troops, Crews, & Packs.

EI 11 - disAbilities Awareness and Inclusion – Sonya Whitehead -The basic premise of Scouting for youth with disabilities is full participation. This session is directed at (1) helping unit leaders develop an awareness of Scouts with disabilities among youth without disabilities within their unit and (2) encouraging the inclusion of Scouts with disabilities and special needs in Cub Scout packs, Boy Scout troops, Varsity Scout teams, Venturing crews, and Sea Scout ships.

EI 12 - Six Knot Challenge – Gary Paczner - Are you up for the Six Knot Challenge? The World Record time of 8.1 seconds for tying these six scout knots was set in 1977 and has not been broken. Come learn to tie the Sheet Bend, Reef Knot, Round Turn with Two Half Hitches, Bowline, Sheepshank, and Clove Hitch, and learn how to host a Six Knot Challenge in your unit

EI 13 - Roundtables: What's in it for Me? - Gary Holewinski - Here's the scoop on what those monthly Roundtables are all about and what you can expect by attending. It's all about helping you to DO YOUR BEST as a Troop, Pack or Den leader by sharing "How To's" you can benefit from. For all leaders.

EI 14 -Fire Starting – Gary Paczner – Can you light a fire without a match? This course will show you other methods to light a fire without a single match!

EI 15 – disAbilities Paperwork Support – Kathy Bomer – This course is designed for adult leaders to develop alternative advancement plan for special-needs scouts when necessary and the paperwork that is required to support the plan.

EL 16 – What is the Sea Scouts Program? – Seafaring has traditions that go back hundreds of years and the Boy Scouts of America has adapted these traditions and, in the process, it has created a tradition of its own – The Sea Scouts! Come and learn all about this exciting co-ed program servicing youth ages 14 to 21 here in Erie Shores Council.

EL 17 - Nature for Cubs and Scouts – Frank Merritt - this course teaches you what you need to know to help your cubs gain an appreciation for the wonders of nature and is designed to help you learn how to help your cubs complete various achievements, electives and Activity Pins and give your scouts interesting projects in the community (**2 hour session**)

Special for Youth Leaders

Running Start Classes!

Y01 - Troop Leadership Training – Pat Sutherland - Troop Leadership Training is the first course in the new Youth Leadership Training Continuum (which also included National Youth Leadership Training and National Youth Advanced Experience) which is designed to help scouts learn what a leader needs to Be – Know – Do! Completion of this course entitles a Scout to where the “Trained” strip in his uniform. (**2 Hour Program**)

Y02 - Chaplain’s Aide – Doug Seidl- The purpose of this program is to Make the 12th point of the Scout Law more meaningful in life, promote a greater understanding of and appreciation for all religions, and provide Boy Scouts with the opportunity to work with an ordained member of the clergy, thereby gaining insight into the religious professional life. (**3 Hour Program**)

Y03 - Den Chief Training – Kym Sloan - Den Chiefs are older Boy Scouts who help Den Leaders provide a full Cub Scout program to boys. They are a valuable resource for Cub Scouting and Cub Scout leaders. This class will teach boys wishing to be den chiefs how to lead Cub Scouts in games, songs, contests, and skits. They will learn how to work with boys and adults and gain a better understanding of their responsibilities. **ALL DAY PROGRAM!**

Y04 - Eagle Project Resources, Planning, and Execution – Kathy Bomer - A step-by-step formula that will get you through your Eagle project, from conception to completion.

Y05 - Leadership Opportunities in the Order of the Arrow – Brent Bomer –

Ever wonder how your Chapter Chiefs and Lodge Chief got to where they are? Find out how to become more active in the Order of the Arrow through leadership opportunities available in your own OA Chapter.

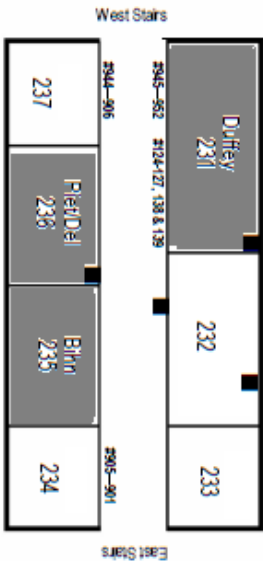
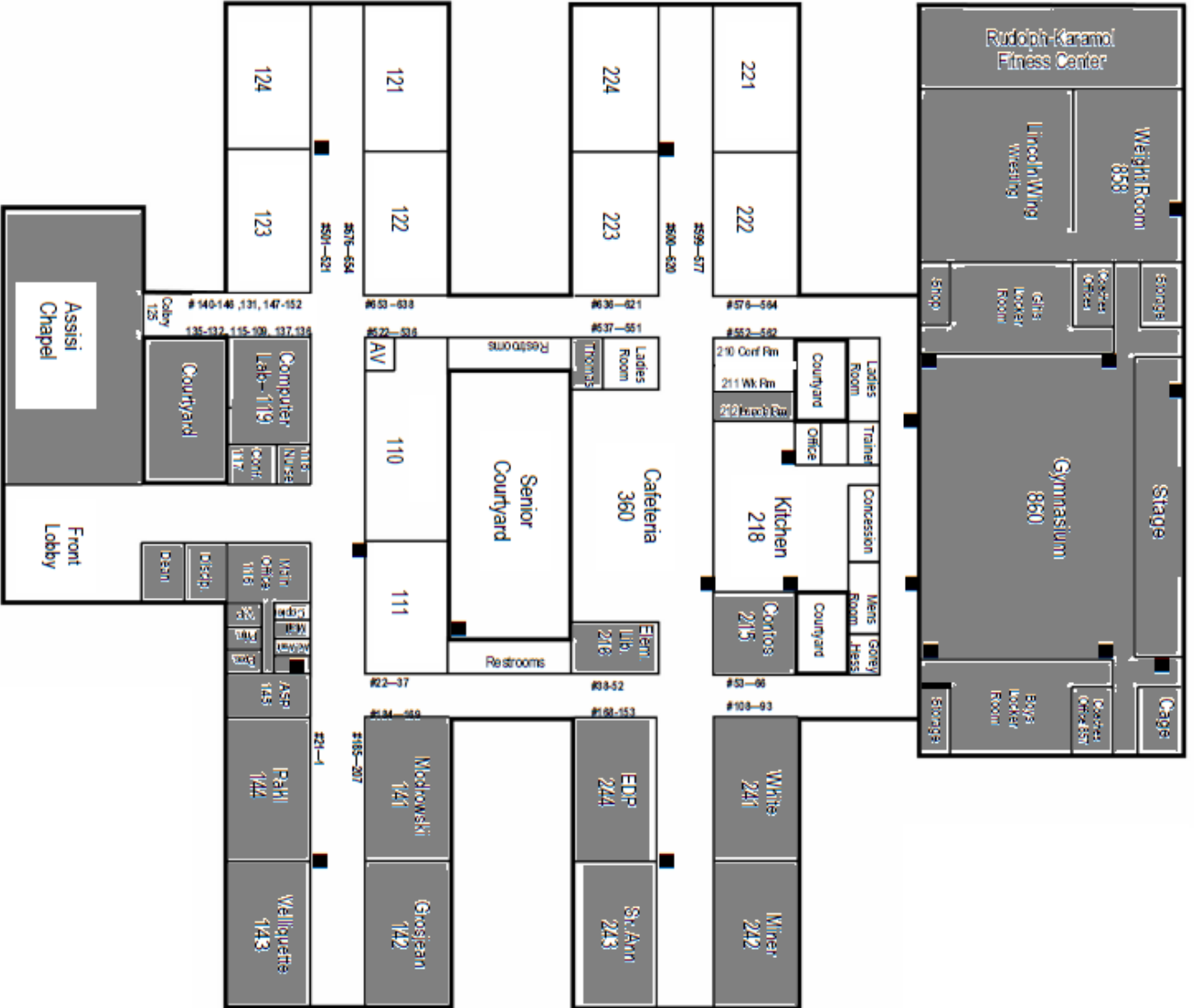
