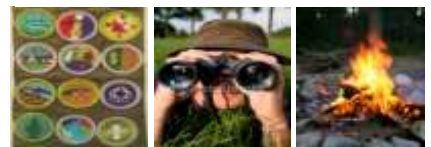

- ☀ Eight will enter a career that was learned through the merit badge system.
- ☀ One will use his Scout skills to save the life of another.
- ☀ Two will use their Scout skills to save their own life.
- ☀ Twenty-one will become adult Scouting volunteers.
- ☀ Three will become Eagle Scouts.
